Geopolitics

The Swedish geographer Rudolf Kjellén first coined the term geopolitics in his 1899 article about the formation of Sweden's natural borders. He describes geopolitics as a theory defining the state as a geographical organism or as a phenomenon within a certain expanse

Geopolitics is the connection between geography and the formation and management of the foreign policy of a certain state or as the geographical influence on the conduct of foreign policy



Geostrategy

In order to capture the connection between geography and strategy, Jakub J. Grygiel coined the holistic expression, geostrategy. By this he meant, “the geographic focus of a state’s foreign policy, or where a state directs its power

...The term strategy originates from the Greek form strategus, translated as the commander or leader of an army, a general...

...Strategy = Ends + Ways + Means...

...Six factors support the confluence of geography with strategy. They are:

- Accessibility
- Mobility
- Visibility
- Communicability
- Availability.
- Vulnerability

These principles are in fact the classical paradigm linking war planning and strategy, meaning that the planning and management of war are completely dependent upon geography. The side that secures geostrategic advantages is the one that will win.

Relationship Between Geopolitics and Geostrategy

Geostrategy is a subfield of geopolitics, Geostrategy is concerned with matching means to ends — in this case, a country's resources (whether they are limited or extensive) with its geopolitical objectives (which can be local, regional, or global). Geopolitics provides the link between geography and strategy

Nigeria's Geostrategic Environment

The geostrategic environment of a country can be defined as the threats, opportunities which are prevalent to the country based on its geographical location.

Nigeria is located in a region of comparatively weaker states in terms of human and financial resources



In general, the topography of Nigeria consists of plains in the north and south interrupted by plateaus and hills in the centre of the country.



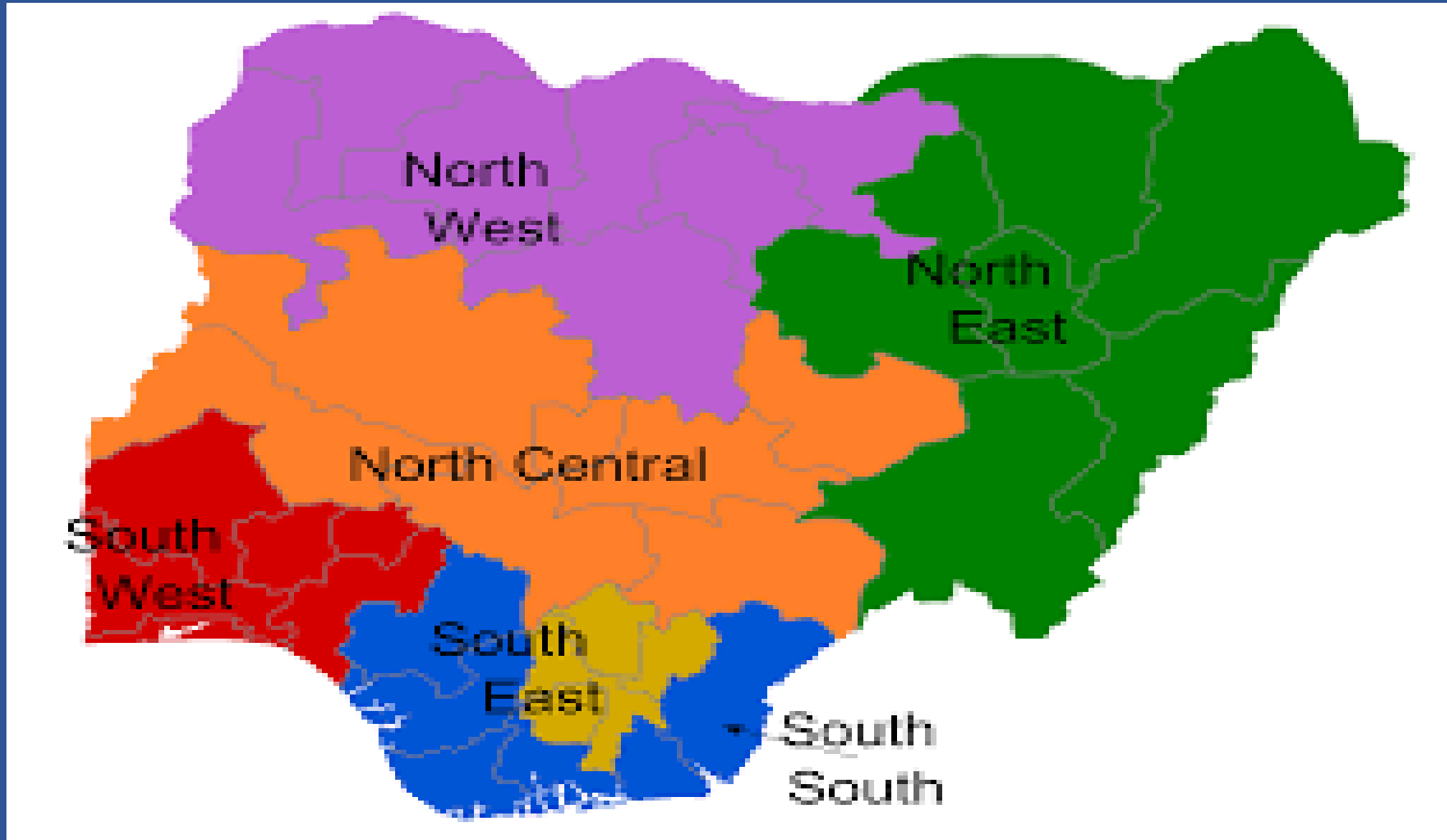

Nigeria – Republic Of Benin

Relations between the two countries can be said to be generally cordial but sometimes marred by occasional outbursts of border clashes.

Nigeria – Cameroun

The relations between Nigeria and Cameroun has been largely chequered, swinging from one end to the other like a pendulum.

Nigeria – Chad

The Republic of Chad shares common borders with Libya in the North, Sudan in the East, and the Central African Republic and Cameroun in the South. In the West, Chad is located between Nigeria, Niger Republic, and some parts of Cameroun.

Nigeria – Equatorial Guinea

Equatorial Guinea, formerly known as Fernandapo is a 100 kilometers South-East of Nigerian Coasts. She is nearer to the Coast of Cameroun, and also very close to the Bights of Benin and Biafra

Nigeria – Republic of Niger

The Republic of Niger borders Nigeria from the North-West to the North-East boundary of Nigeria with Chad. It is interesting to note that unlike other Nigerian immediate neighbours, there has not been any record of any violent border clash between the two countries.

Internal Factor

The Majority of these coups have happened in Francophone countries, in fact 5 of the 6 coups which have taken place since 2019 were in Francophone countries.

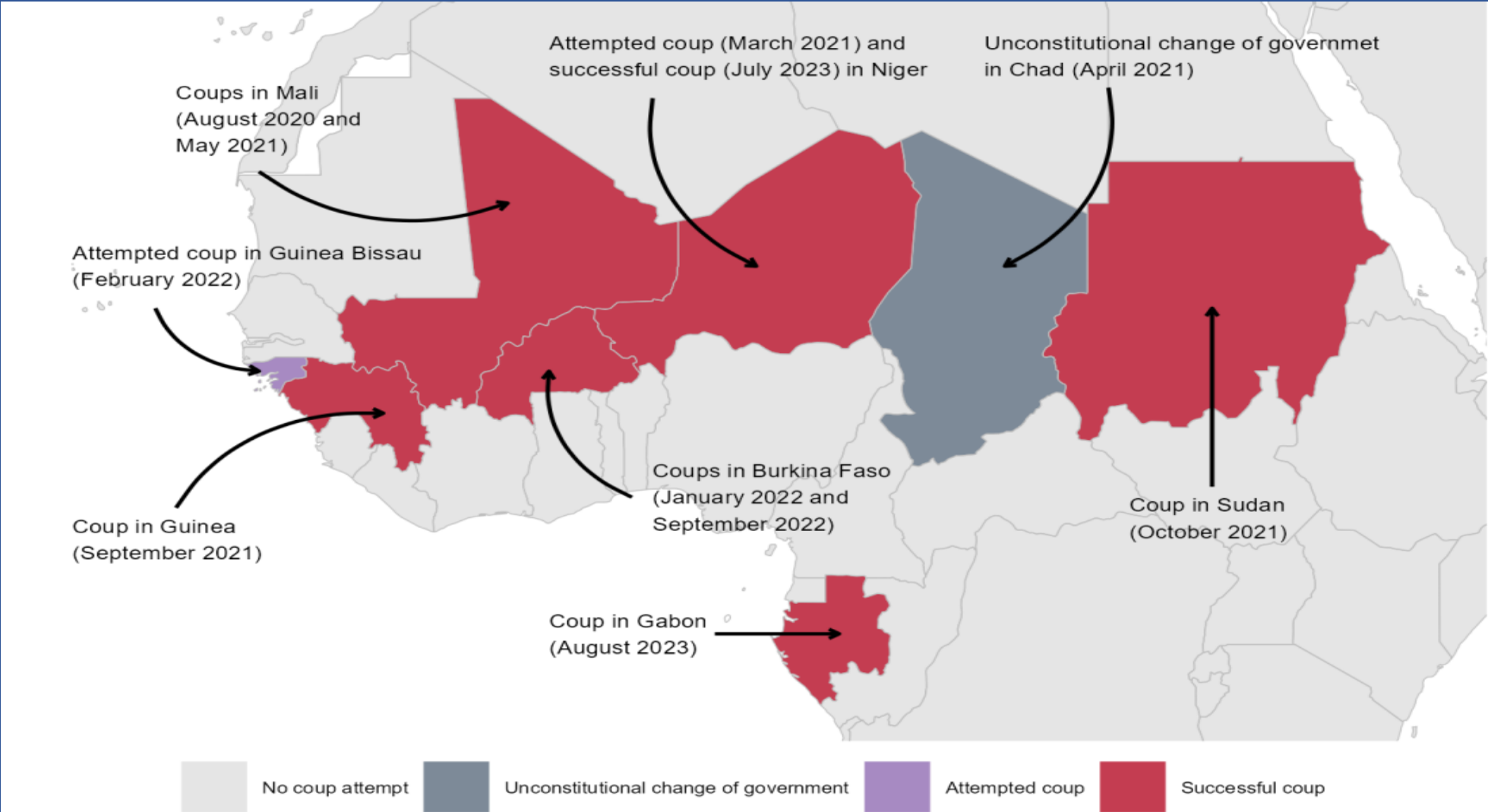
Threat to Democracy in ECOWAS
